Treatment usually starts immediately, and we know only too well that being diagnosed with cancer is a frightening experience for a child and their family.

As part of the ongoing support that we provide for families and children who are being treated for cancer at The John Radcliffe Hospital in Oxford and in surrounding specialist hospitals, once again we're aiming to donate a teddy to each child who desperately needs a hug.

Many children will visit their Oncology Ward at some point over the festive period, or for those who are too poorly to make the journey, will receive a home visit and sadly for many of them, this will be their last Christmas. We too only had just one Christmas with Taylan after he was diagnosed with a brain tumour.

Last year, our successful appeal granted over 140 cuddly teddies, reaching children in Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire, Berkshire and Northamptonshire.
